

Mrs. Philipp Bunney Geneiveve (Jenny) Guillet Bunney Jan 16, 1847-Oct 13, 1924

The word of the death of Mrs. Philipp Bunney of this city (Michigan) passed away last Monday morning (October 13, 1924) was expectedly received as she had been reported very low for several days prior. Mrs. Bunney had been in bed for ten weeks and there three weeks she suffered a stroke that paralyzed her left side that effected her speech so that she could hardly talk. The last two weeks she didn't take any nourishment what so ever.

At the time she past she was 77 years old, the birth day was in September. Jennie was born in Eastern Canada in 1847. In 1871, she married Philipp Bunney with whom she came to this part of the country in 1882 first settling in Grand Forks. Later coming to Michigan City vicinity where they have been residents for the past thirty years.

To this union ten children were born of whom seven still living. All were able to attend the funeral but one (Gillis Bunney) who lives in Canada and was prevented from attending due to sickness in his family. The funeral services were held in the Catholic Church on Wednesday at 10:30 a.m. with Rev Mc Donald officiating. Internment was made in Michigan Cemetery.
