

Gillos Bunney Dies After Long Illness

Gillos Bunney, 58, of Minot, died at 6:15 p.m. Wednesday in a Minot hospital, where he had been ill for five months.

Definite funeral arrangements are delayed awaiting word from relatives. Members of the family said, however, that the services will be from the Finnegan chapel Saturday or Monday.

Survivors include five sons, five grandchildren, four brothers and two sisters. The sons are Edward of Mohall, Robert, Ernest, Howard and Willard of Minot and the daughters, Ruth and Emma of Minot. Samuel Bunney of Maples, N.D.; Jillos of Palto, Sask., and John and Joe Bunney of Minot are the brothers, and the sisters are Mrs. Leo Hynes of Michigan, N.D., and Mrs. Ernest McHaffey of Hastings, Minn,

Mr. Bunney, resident of North Dakota for 45 years, came to Minot in 1916 and had lived here continuously since.

He was born in June 1877 at Glen Falls, N.Y.
